Sector cuts and the Compact

Compact Voice is concerned that cuts might be happening in a non-Compact compliant way which threatens the sustainability of local services and voluntary sector providers. It has published [guidance for both public bodies and local groups](#) on how to manage cuts better.

Equality Act 2010

The Equality Act will come into force in October. The Government Equalities Office and the Equality and Diversity Forum have published [Equality Act 2010: What do I need to know?](#) A summary guide for voluntary and community sector service providers. National Minimum Wage

From 1 October 2010 new rates and age bands will apply: Workers aged 21 and over - £5.93; 18-29 - £4.92; 16-17 - £3.64. There is also a new minimum wage of £2.50 per hour for apprentices who are either under 19 or in the first year of their apprenticeship. [More information on the DirectGov website](#).
